The M.A. seminar will focus on English literature and culture (with the elements of European and non-European aspects) of the 19th, 20th and 21st centuries in the field of poetry, aesthetics, music, philosophy, architecture and other arts. The M.A. topics will be selected (and suggested) by students themselves and will address such fields as: cultural (historical, aesthetic and others) background(s) of romanticism especially Victorian poetry and prose, women poets and women literature (in the 19th and 20th centuries), the literary studies of the turn of the centuries (the last two decades of the 19th century), literature and philosophy, literature and cultural studies, literature and humor, historical aspects of literature, literature and music (art, aesthetics, sculpture, architecture), (post)modernist studies with their cultural dimensions (including pop culture, music and other fields such as cinematographic art, sport, etc.), English studies and their reference to European (and non-European) cultures, literature and “aesthetics of everyday life”, women fiction of the 20th century, poetry of the 20th century (with various aspects of Irish, Polish, German, Spanish, Italian and Polish poetry/literature), etc. Students will be requested to read and analyze some selected texts on literary theory, aesthetics and culture which will be discussed during seminar meetings. Their own [Students’] texts on the reading list will be also taken into consideration when requested. During the introductory seminar meetings all topics will be individually discussed with students and most important information concerning the technique, methods and the stylesheet of M.A. writing will be explained and discussed.
